

House Party Exercise

Now that we have completed the survey, we would like to do a little exercise in the form of a role-play, and we will want to capture notes. The quantitative data in the survey and qualitative from this exercise will give us a more robust understanding of our community.

Scenario:

You have been appointed the Mayor, Governor, or President, and you have <u>ONE issue</u> you can resolve. What would you resolve, and how would you address it? Everyone else will play a constituent. The Mayor, Gov, or President have come to answer their constituents about their decision.

Exercise notes:

- 1. Break into groups of not more than 5-6 people
- 2. Provide note card(s) and pen(s)
- 3. Quickly select one person to play Mayor, Gov, or President and one to take notes.
- 4. Constituents should feel free to play any role a constituent would play (agree or disagree)
- 5. Mayor, Gov, and President can make up any static, within reason
- 6. After the role-play is over, if time allows, switch up roles and repeat
- 7. When the Townhall/House Party concludes, please complete this debrief form with all the notes from the exercise.
