Following their naturalization and using resources provided by GALEO, they were able to become an informed and educated voter in the 2020 monumental election. Additionally, they recently graduated from the GALEO Institute of Leadership in 2021. Dafne* continues to support GALEO in ongoing voter engagement projects.
